

Visit Rockville on Saturday and celebrate the 200th birthday of the **Beall-Dawson House** with tours, activities, and games for all ages. Bike to the **Red Brick Courthouse** for Peerless Rockville's 10am guided bicycle tour of historic Rockville, or join a walking tour of the Courthouse Square Historic District at 11am or 1pm.

Stop by Olney and visit **Oakley Cabin** (Sat.), the restored 1880s home to African American tenant families, with storytelling by the Griots' Circle of Maryland and string band folk music. The **Olney Theatre Center** offers hourly tours on Saturday from 1-4pm. At 5pm, enjoy "Musicals from Stage to Film and Back Again," a look at the history of musical comedies with excerpts from *Guys and Dolls, On the Town*, and *Chicago*.

See the new "Clay" exhibit in the gallery at the **Hyattstown Mill** (Sat. & Sun. in Clarksburg), with clay art & pottery demonstrations and crafts for kids. Music throughout the day on Saturday.

Pack a picnic, grab your Heritage Days brochure, and enjoy the day exploring Montgomery County!



2015 Maryland Preservation Awards

Congratulations to the Montgomery County awardees of 2015 Maryland Preservation Awards! Each year, the Maryland Historical Trust celebrates the best efforts in historic preservation from around the state.

The Montgomery County Historic Preservation Office was cited for Excellence in Community Engagement for Montgomery Modern, a web page, video, and guidebook educating the public about local mid-century modern buildings and communities.

Owners Sandy and Duane Heiler were recognized for Excellence in Residential Rehabilitation for their work with architect Miche Booz repairing, rehabilitating, and adding to the historic Thomas-Bentley House in Brookeville, where President Madison sought refuge during the War of 1812.

The National Institutes of Health's Historic Preservation Program was noted for Outstanding Stewardship by a Government Agency for efforts in the historic preservation of its Bethesda campus.


