REWIND: "I commence my journal...": What Carrie Miller Farquhar Told Her Diary and What She Left Out

Like many women of her generation, Carrie Miller Farquhar (1842-1904) kept a diary for much of her life. Carrie's words offer present-day historians a wealth of detail about mid-late 19th-century education, faith, politics, war, agriculture, child-rearing, and social activities in Montgomery County. **Free**.
